

## COURSE EXPECTATIONS

### Pottery Levels 1 and 2

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#### I. Course Overview:

Pottery Level 1 is a foundation course and prerequisite for all other Pottery levels.

This course focuses on exploring various methods of working with clay. Half of the course will be focused on handbuilding, while the other half will focus on wheel throwing. This course will introduce students to all clay techniques. This course will allow students to focus on clay craftsmanship, creativity, function, and aesthetics. Pottery Level 1 classes will focus on technique, while upper level Pottery students will have more autonomy and choice in their clay projects.

##### *Classroom Rules:*

3. Contact home
  - a. The student's parents/guardians will be notified of the student's infractions.

#### VI. Grading Policy (points):

- Weekly *Social and Civic Expectations* grade (20 points per week – 5 per expectation) makeup around 400 possible points total for this class. This grade reflects the student's weekly in-class behavior -- his/her ability to be responsible, respectful toward others and him/herself, safe, and honest.
- *Projects* (~100 points each) makeup about 400 points total for this class.
- Completion of each rubric and self-reflection is worth 5% of the student's overall project grade.
- Returning course expectations (this sheet) (5 points).
- The final assessment will count as 20% of the semester grade.

#### VII. Academic Integrity Statement

The faculty and administration of Wheeler Middle/High School demand high standards of academic performance and academic honesty.
