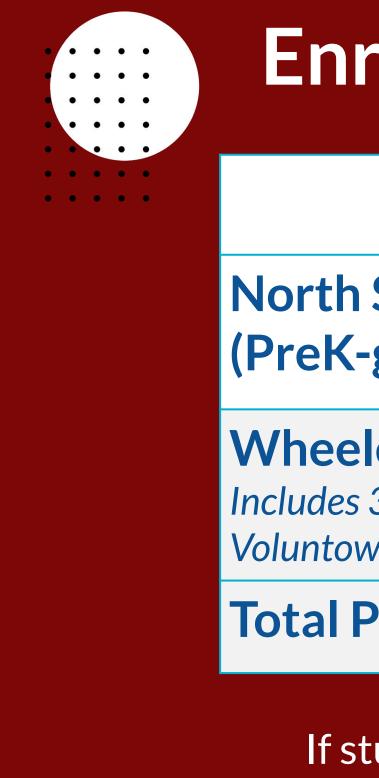

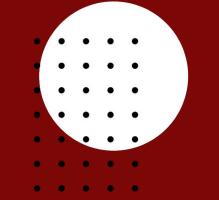

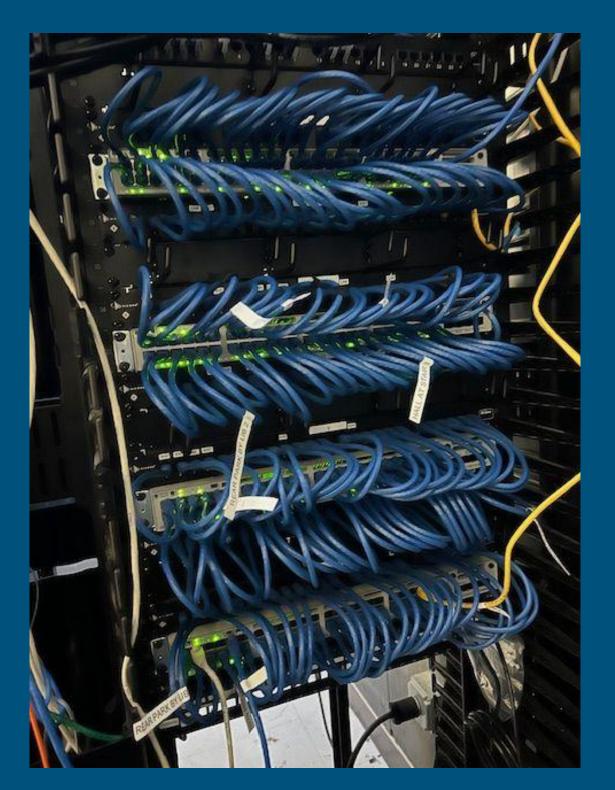
Sustainable Technology Plan

TECHNOLOGY-INFRASTRUCTURE

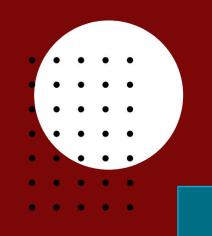


We are experiencing IT infrastructure failures

We must replace aging infrastructure in order to maintain functionality (Internet, phones, public address system, cameras)

The budget includes \$20,200 for IT infrastructure replacement. Plan - Over 5 years replace all switches (equivalent of 30), access points, servers, and firewall.

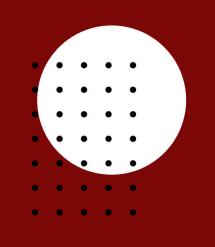
