Goal Update

North Stonington Elementary

- Teachers of students in grades 5-6 engaged in a training on Student Led Conferences. This new format will replace traditional parentteacher conferences in April. 5th and 6th grade students will share a reflective portfolio of their work this year and set goals with their parents.
- Last month, 3rd grade teachers welcomed teachers from Preston into their classrooms as part of our ongoing *Into Reading* site visit program. A grade 2 collaboration is in the works!
- IXL mid-year testing is in its final stages. This benchmark will give us vital Math and ELA data. Interventionist have been meeting with teams to review data as part of the new SAT process.

<u>Wheeler Middle School</u>

- In lieu of Mid-Year Assessments students in grades 7 and 8 engaged in week long interdisciplinary units.
- To demonstrate progress towards the Vision of the Graduate, teachers and students are working hard on digital Student Led Conference Portfolios.
- Students continue to practice skills during the reimagined FLEX period. Students continue to receive varied levels of support based on eight week data review cycles.

<u>Wheeler High School</u>

- Students completed Mid-Year Assessments that are based on academic expectations. Teachers have been providing feedback on school-wide rubrics and students are reflecting on their progress in meaningful ways.
- As we continue to refine the usage of these rubrics, departments are discussing changes and practical classroom applications.
- For the first time the Social/Civic Expectations of respect, responsibility and resilience were evaluated in each class!
